Outside experts have determined that half of our schools are in need of repairs and renovations to *more than* 75% of the entire building.



The majority of our schools need *seismic improvements* and *security upgrades* to ensure student safety and keep facilities operable for years to come.

Under current capital funding rates, Granite School District can afford to rebuild one elementary school every eight years. This means our 90+ school buildings need to last, on average, more than 150 years.



- We propose a responsible plan that addresses the needs of our school buildings with the least amount of impact to taxpayers.
- By acting now, we save taxpayers money by taking advantage of low interest rates and beginning projects before construction prices rise even further.



- Granite District operates within its means. Property taxes are below the state average, and administrative costs are among the lowest in the nation.
- However, the current capital levy is simply not enough to meet the needs of our students, families, and community.
